Community Pride Starts at Home! We are fortunate to have many visitors over the summer months. And while it is nice to show off our community to them, let's also remember that 'we' see it every day. Let your pride show and trim up your yard, paint the fence or do whatever it is that you've been putting off. Let's show our visitors and each other, that we are proud of our little piece of the universe. Commissionaires will be visiting town again during the month August to check on untidy properties.

Compost bags are available free of charge at the Town Office. Please keep them at a manageable weight and remember no rocks or garbage!
Compost is scheduled to be picked up Monday & Wednesdays (if time & weather permits)

Branches should be stacked on the boulevard piled parallel to the road in no more than 8-10-foot lengths. The reason we like to have them alongside the boulevard is for easy access and removal. Removal with the skid steer can damage boulevards so keeping them on a harder surface makes it easier for everyone.



SaskWater Helpful tips to save water and money!

This summer, save a drop. Save a lot. With these simple water conservation tips:

- © Watering your lawn for one hour or less, twice a week is sufficient
- © For best results, avoid watering during the hottest time of the day or when it's raining or windy.
- © Use sprinklers that throw big drops of water close to the ground. Smaller drops of water and mist often evaporate before reaching your lawn.
- © Aerate, compost and weed your lawn to increase moisture retention.
- When mowing, cut the top 1/3 of the grass and leave clippings behind. They are a natural fertilizer and help the soil retain moisture.
- © Collect water in a rain barrel and use it to water outdoor plants.
- Instead of washing your car with a running hose, use a bucket and sponge, then rinse using a trigger nozzle on your hose.
- © Use a broom instead of a hose to clean your driveway or sidewalk

Star City Housing Authority is seeking a GROUNDS MAINTENANCE CONTRACTOR

This is a contract position responsible for the maintenance of the grounds of the Housing Authority units in Star City.

Maintenance Contractor responsibilities include: Develop (with the Manger) and execute maintenance plans and schedules, ensure timely attention to maintenance issues and seasonal grounds requirements, act as a contact person for the Housing Authority when required, ensure assets are maintained in good repair and operated in an efficient, effective manner. The Maintenance Contractor receives general direction from the Manger and reports indirectly to the Board of Directors.

The successful candidate must be able to perform or sub-contract the following duties:

- Seasonal grounds maintenance (snow removal, grass cutting, watering, weed control, cleaning of eave troughs and extensions).

In addition, the Maintenance Contractor must be able to:

- Communicate effectively, verbal and written
- Maintain confidentiality
- Work collaboratively with the Manger
