4. Waste Management fee shall be set as follows: **Residential Users**

POLICY NO. 20-02 FALSE ALARM POLICY - Effective" January 1st, 2021

<u>1.PURPOSE</u>: To reduce the number of Fire Department responses to False Alarms by promoting the proper use and maintenance of alarm systems and assigning a set of procedures and associated rates.

<u>4.FEES</u> a) False Alarm fees may be charged to the property owner and are subject to Town of Star City payment terms, interest rates and collection polices. Fees will be charged as follows:

i) First False Alarm in the calendar year – no charge, a courtesy letter will be issued to the property owner with instructions to contact the alarm system provider to reduce the likelihood of further occurrences. Notification rated rates for further False Alarms will be included in the letter.

ii) Additional False Alarms - please refer to Schedule A Policy No. 20-03 Fire Department Policy (noted below).

WINTER REMINDERS!! Please remember the following as we head into the winter months ...

 \sim Park vehicles in driveways and <u>NOT</u> on the streets during winter months to ensure the grader can get through for snow removal. If you need to park on the streets, please have your vehicle moved after a big snow fall so it does not get blocked in by the snow plow.

~ Remember to bring in your garabage/recycle bins off the streets once they have been emptied to allow for the proper snow removal

~ When removing snow from your property, please be considerate of your neighbors and do not blow into their yards. Also do not push snow onto the streets from your driveways/walkways.

~ The driveway wing, when lowered should reduce the amount of snow left on driveway approaches but it will not eliminate a snow ridge. Unless this ridge is quite significant (more than 12 inches) staff will not return to remove it - this also applies to the ridges left in the back alley. Anything less than 12 inches is to be removed by the homeowner.

~ **ATTENTION PARENTS**: Please make sure your kid(s) <u>don't</u> play on the snow ridges alongside the streets. This may be dangerous as they may slip off as a vehicle is passing by or when the town is pushing up snow they may not been seen. Please play safe.


