The Commissionaires will be visiting our Town sometime in May. Please make sure to clean up your yards and have your pets licensed as these are a few issues they will be focusing on.

Star City has now partnered with Call2Recycle and has a battery recycle station at the Town Office. Rechargeable batteries (commonly found in cordless power tools, cell phones, cameras, two-way radios, etc.) and Single Use batteries (commonly found in remote controls, toys, watches, pace makers, hearing aids, fire alarms, etc.) are accepted.

Before you drop your batteries into the collection box please:

- 1) Tape Terminals – cover the terminal with clear packing tape, duct tape or electrical tape (avoid covering the battery label)
- 2) Bag & Seal – place each battery in a clear sealable / zipped bag (multiple cylindrical alkaline batteries may be wrapped together (AA, AAA)

Spring has sprung and the Town is once again picking up compost and tree branches in an effort to keep the Town looking neat & tidy. This service is provided free of charge however please note that our Public Works staff are busy during the summer months, so a limited amount of time is assigned for this task. Monday & Wednesday mornings (if time & weather permits) have been designated for compost & tree branch pick up. If you have an excess amount of trees and/or compost, please contact our office to make arrangements to have them removed. Additional charges may apply. Just a reminder NOT to put dog waste into the compost bags – it belongs in the garbage!

As a reminder compost bags are available free of charge at the Town Office. Remember to keep compost bags at a manageable weight and remember no rocks or garbage! Please put compost in clear bags and not in boxes!

Branches should be stacked on the boulevard piled parallel to the road in no more than 8-10 foot lengths. The reason we like to have them alongside the boulevard is for easy access and removal. Removal with the skid steer can damage boulevards so keeping them on a harder surface makes it easier for everyone.
